GHOST HUNTING IN NEVADA

Thursday, November 3 10:30 a.m. at the NHS

The Comstock Historic District includes Virginia City, Gold Hill, Silver City, the historic part of Dayton, and the historic Sutro site. It is one of the largest and most important National Historic Landmarks in the U.S.

It also ranks as one of the most haunted locations in America and is at the top of every ghost hunter's mustvisit list!

Jeadene Solberg, Executive Director of Northern Nevada Ghost Hunters, will discuss why paranormal investigators

believe the Comstock is so haunted and the possible origins of the legends associated with these spirit encounters.

Northern Nevada Ghost Hunters seek to investigate paranormal events with all tools at their disposal, with a scientific approach. They "explore history one spirit at a time," using historical data as their primary source.

Northern Nevada Ghost Hunters runs Gold Hill Ghost Tours, Haunted Hills and Mills, and National Ghost Hunting Day on the Comstock. All proceeds stay on the Comstock and are donated back to the Comstock Foundation for History and Culture.

Tiffany Jones, Renaissance Woman

Say hello to Tiffany Jones, the new office manager for the NHS.

A fifth-generation Nevadan, Tiffany's ancestors headed west and wound up in Toano and later Metropolis, both near Wells, in Elko County. Today, they are ghost towns, but Toano, like Reno, was created in 1868 by the Central Pacific Railroad, while Metropolis had dreams of being a major agricultural center until the town lost a waterrights battle with Lovelock.

Later, Tiffany's family owned a ranch in Welcome, also near Wells. Tiffany grew up in Elko but came to Reno to attend UNR. She graduated with a double major in French and International Affairs and a minor in International Energy. She also attended an intensive language program at Pau, France.

For five years, Tiffany lived in Las Vegas, doing purchasing and administrative work. She returned to Reno in 2018, becoming an accountant for Maddie's Pet Project and the Walker Basin Conservancy.

She enjoys being outdoors camping, hiking, and kayaking. She started dancing at the age of four. Tiffany calls herself "a huge animal lover—cats and dogs equally" and shares her life with a cat. She loves history and art and includes oil painting and book binding among her skills.
