

Nevada's Oldest Museum

The Nevada Historical Society is the oldest cultural institution in the state of Nevada. It was created in 1904 with newspaper publisher Robert Fulton as president and Jeanne Elizabeth Wier as executive secretary. Wier would become chairman of the Department of History and Political Science at the University of Nevada and Director of the NHS until her death in 1950.

Wier was the driving force behind the organization and collected materials of importance to Nevada's history — newspapers, manuscripts, photographs, maps, books and artifacts. Wier kept the collection in her home until the first permanent NHS facility opened on University Avenue in 1913.

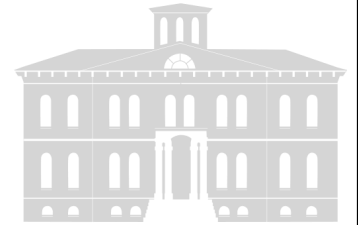

Museum Store: Learn to greet and direct visitors, ring up sales, answer basic questions, answer the phone, ring up Admission sales, help with store projects.

Front Office: Learn to greet and direct visitors, answer phones, transfer calls, give general information, use the cash register and credit card machine, instruct museum visitors about areas of museum, assist administrator with data entry, records, mail.

How to Give a Tour: You will be taken on a tour by an expert tour guide; then shadow a docent giving a tour of a section; learn the major areas of the museum: Native Americans, Mining, Transportation, Pioneer and Early Reno; learn about the various artifacts in the museum and how to engage adults and children's interest while giving a tour.

You will get the necessary training to work in the Museum Store, Admissions Office, Gallery Tours and Collections.



Docents perform vital work in all areas of the historical society, including in the galleries as tour guides, in the research library, artifacts, manuscript, and photograph collections, and in the front office and museum store.

To become a NHS Docent you must complete the two hour training class, and attend at least three lectures. You must become a member of Nevada Historical Society and the Docent Council, and commit to working a minimum of 48 hours per year for the Society and the Docent Council. Docent dues are \$15 annually.
